In a health system, an interprofessional relationship exists when two or more health practitioners act interdependently with a common goal of encouraging honesty in any discussions and ensuring that all the problems with the health facility are solved amicably. Interprofessional relationships ensure collaboration in many ways.

Relationships among clinicians in various occupations are mediated by the expectation that doctors assume responsibility for patient management and coordinating roles in health care teams, and the degree of acuity of particular health care settings.

Interprofessional teamwork is recognised as a cornerstone for both the philosophy and practice of somatic rehabilitation [1]. It emphasises how teams comprising different health care professionals use a shared strategy to work together towards common aims [2].

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
