Peitho was usually depicted as a woman with her hand raised in the act of persuasion or fleeing from the scene of a rape. Her attributes were a ball of twine and a dove.

All three of the great poets of ancient Greek tragedy wrote for an audience that enjoyed displays of rhetoric. Many scenes turn on attempts at persuasion, which may be couched in set speeches or in stichomythia (line-on-line dialogue). Frequently, set speeches are paired in a formal agōn (contest) and use arguments from eikos (what is likely).
